Excerpt from Grace C from 3A Powerpoint 'Trapped in the Dark'

I sat in my room with Chelsea, wondering what we should do. Suddenly, I thought of an idea, I got off of my giant, pink beanbag and grabbed Chelsea's hand. We ran up the stairs thumping like giant grey Elephants. Eventually we got up into my cool attic and played a few fun games.

We were definitely trapped. Chelsea and I loudly yelled and screamed for help but my mum and dad didn't come to get us out. I was trembling with fear but I finally realised that they weren't there, heh... Both of us were terrified, fearful, and scared, I was worried if we won't ever get out!

Excerpt from Eason L 6E Analysis of "Somewhere around the corner"

Somewhere around the Corner is a historical fiction genre novel which centres on Barbara, a 12 year old homeless foster girl, who lives on the street of Sydney in 1994. Her mother, a drug addict, is a terrible liar that Barbara never could've trusted or relied on. Barbara, who'd lost herself in a demonstration, meets an old man who advises her to go around the corner, leading her into the year 1932, a staggering point during The Great Depression. She finds herself lost in another demo, but this time no one came to give her advice. Just as she's about to be attacked, a teenage boy saves Barbara, thus giving her someone to rely on. The boy, who we find out is named Young Jim, needs to get to his parents in the Poverty Gully. Making their way to the gully, they find rows and rows of shacks until they find a particular shack that Young Jim calls home. Arriving at the shack, Barbara meets Jim's family, the O'Reilly family. They greet her with a warm welcome, which she didn't feel "very accustomed to. But, it was a nice feeling. A feeling Barbara hadn't felt in the present. Although she is living in a beatdown shack during The Great Depression, she feels a strong, omnipresent love coming from the O'Reilly family that her carers never gave her. Unfortunately, a flood enters the gully, flooding the area Barbara was at, forcing her to go around the corner. Now in 1994, Barbara is back to being along on the streets, but she hadn't given up yet. Barbara is determined to find Young Jim, and her hopes had to be fulfilled once she'd found out he was still alive. She gets the bus fare, arrives at the bus stop, gets picked up by a car, arrives at the hospital and she finally enters his room. He finds Jim, but she's realised something. Young Jim was the old man from the demonstration, and he'd specifically talked to Barbara





because he knew her. Jim is excited, seeing her for the first time in 62 years, and tells him all the specifics after she has supposedly died. Now at Jim's house, she goes to sleep and calls it a day. The next day, she goes to the hospital all dressed up and meets Helen, Jim's oldest daughter. She offers both Jim and Barbara to stay at her place, and both accepted. In conclusion, Jackie French has written one of the most pleasing historical novels I've ever read. French uses an outstanding set of a general and colloquial vocabulary, and really gives you a thorough, deepened understanding of characters, settings, events and actions. The conjunction of terrific, descriptive noun groups, distinct verb groups, unbelievable characters development and a surprisingly meaningful theme really makes her work deserve the prowess it's given. 'Somewhere around the Corner' is the name, and it's set in the year 1994. From the first few pages, you won't be able to tell what it's about at all, but once she is sent to 1932, the story takes a jumping turn. Even from only reading the first through chapters, you can tell her writing style is full of ticks and turns. This isn't my only reason to justify my love for her writing style, though, as Jackie French nail's figurative language onto the nailing board as well. Scenes like the hospital scene and Gully Jack's house give you a sense of every emotion, action, sound, sight, smell and taste, which is especially seen in the mutton sandwich scene. Honestly, a movie or animation of a high budget would deal all of us well. So, essentially, Jackie French is one of the greatest children book writers of all time, and really put her blood, sweat, and tears into 'Somewhere around the Corner'. The work it took to create such a surreal book, a book that could only be described and seen in my dreams. It takes nearly every amazing aspect of a book like the afore said noun groups, verb groups, character developments and themes, and then precisely builds a great story. So, in conclusion, do I recommend Jackie French's 'Somewhere around the corner'? Absolutely. Jackie's a miracle writer.


