#### Safe Parking around schools

#### **Exemption from School**

Families intending to commence Summer Holidays earlier than December 12th, and who will be away from school for longer than 10 school days, need to complete an Exemption from Compulsory Schooling form. The form is available from the school's front office. The new school year commences on Monday 26th January 2026. If your family is not back to commence the school year on day one, you will need to complete a Day Eight attendance form. This is available from the office. To effectively plan for classes in 2026, it is imperative that families complete the Day Eight Attendance form before the end of the 2025 school year.

Dear Sir/Madam,

#### Parking matters at 2 Boowaggan Road, Merrimac QLD 4226.

Please be advised that the Council of the City of Gold Coast (Council) has received complaints related to vehicles being parked in a manner that is in breach of the Queensland Road Rules.

Council undertakes parking enforcement operations to address illegal parking activities that pose a potential risk to public safety, protect footpath/nature strip infrastructure, protect community amenity and promote fair and equitable use of curb side resources.

Examples of illegal parking activities include

- Stopping in a bus zone
- Stopping on a yellow line
- Vehicle parking for extended periods

- Stopping in a position that obstructs access (driveway)
  Stopping on footpaths and nature strips (verge parking)
  Stopping on a road within 20m before a children's crossing or 10m after a children's crossing, or in an area, to which a parking control sign applies

Further inspections may be conducted throughout the school term

Please be advised that parking illegally may result in the issuance of a penalty infringement

I have attached for your reference educational material, which you may use to include in your school newsletter and social media to remind parents to park safely and legally.

School zones can be busy places, especially during the start and end of the school day. Pick-up and drop-off are the busiest times outside a school. With an increased number of pedestrians and vehicles around, motorists need to take care when parking to keep the roads safe for everyone.

#### Always remember

- Obeying parking signs and road rules is key to creating a safe environment for children and other road users.
- Parking further away and walking children to their school gate may be required to park safely and legally.
- . Be aware that road and parking rules may change during school hours

That it is an offence to stop:

- . 20m before or 10m after a signposted pedestrian or supervised children's crossing.
- 20m before or 10m after a bus stop or within a bus zone (bayed area).
- within 10m of an intersection or corner
- . on a footpath or nature strip within a built-up area. in a way that restricts access to a driveway.
- in a no parking zone for more than 2 minutes, in a no stopping zone, or on a yellow line.
- double parked at any time, as it blocks visibility and causes cars to overtake each other to proceed, creating a traffic hazard.





Unless you are driving a bus that seats more than 12 people (including the driver), you must not stop in a bus zone at any time.

You must not stop a vehicle closer than 20m before and 10m after a bus stop. This gives room for the bus to enter and



The passenger loading zone sign indicates an area designated for picking up or dropping off passengers. You must not remain in the zone for

longer than signed (generally 2 minutes). This sign often displays times during which the loading zone applies.



A driver must not stop where a no stopping sign or yellow 'no stopping' line applies, even to drop off or collect passengers.

No stopping areas may be defineate with a regulatory sign and/or with a continuous yellow line marked on
